<u>Overview</u> – The Georgia Master Naturalist Program is a series programs (usually weekly) with specific environmental topics. The program is a combination of classroom lectures and outside hands-on learning. Total program time is 48 hours of instruction. Class size is generally limited to 24 people. Programs are usually offered on weekdays ONLY but some programs may be offered at other times. Contact the program in your area for details.

<u>Topics</u> – Topics could include - Introduction to Naturalist Programs, Ecology, Forestry, Wildlife, Insects, Water, Human Impact, Geology, Tree ID, Animal ID, Urban Ecology, Environmental Issue, and Agriculture. The topics are designed to teach participants about natural resource management, use, and conservation. We emphasize human use of natural resources through sound management.

<u>Cost</u> – Cost varies by host but is approximately \$300-\$600 for the course and may include learning material, logo shirt, logo nametag, recognition of completion, and refreshments. Students are responsible for their own transportation and lunch. Discounts may be available for members of the same family.
